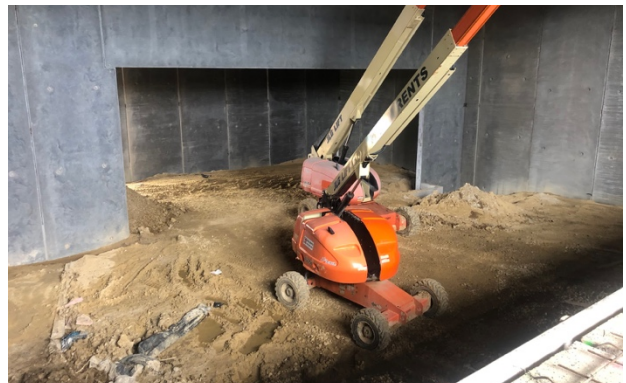
Mr. Allison's hallway is all moved back into their newly refinished rooms.
